

Kaibab Paiute Tribe Substance Abuse Program



The purpose of the Kaibab Band of Paiute Indians Substance Abuse Program is to provide Alcohol and Substance Abuse Treatment, Prevention and Education to its tribal membership, spouses, children, staff and any tribally enrolled Native American that resides in the service area. Limited services available for tribal members outside the service area upon request.

The tribe employs a Licensed Advanced Substance Use Disorder Counselor LASUDC that is required to meet State requirements to maintain a license to provide Substance Abuse Counseling. The LASUDC is trained in the Substance Abuse Subtle Screening Inventory SASSI, Addiction Severity Index ASI, and American Society of Addiction Medicine ASAM. The LASUDC is licensed for MVD revocation packets.

OUTPATIENT TREATMENT

Comprehensive Alcohol and Drug Evaluations and recommendations based on placement criteria

Substance Abuse Treatment based on the 12 step / White Bison Models, Mindfulness Based Relapse Prevention and Stress Reduction models, and others

Provides Substance Abuse Counseling for court ordered or self referred individuals, groups, and family members

Provides Case Management by linking clients to appropriate services and makes referrals to appropriate treatment facilities and community resources, including Mental Health, IHS, state, federal, and/or tribal organizations

Assists with housing, education and employment
Attends court hearings and provides reports based on assessment and progress

Maintains client records including but not limited to: release of information forms, intake documents, case notes, treatment plans, correspondence, physicians release and reports, court orders, legal documents, progress reports, referrals, discharge summaries, lab results, etc.

Alcohol and drug testing

Support for families

Refers clients to support groups such as AA, Al-Anon, NA or Talking Circle

Transports and participates in recovery events such as Red Road, NAI-AA, etc.

Participates in weekly staffing with Licensed Mental Health

Collaborates with Tribal Administration (HR) for employee alcohol/drug testing

Collaborates with Mental Health, Social Services, Child Protection Services, Probation and Parole, Tribal Court, surrounding courts, BIA, etc.
